President's Message

Brian Johnson



With the new year comes new opportunities for change and growth both for the club and for our collections. We're welcoming two new officers for 2026, Patty Graziano is taking on treasurer duties and Joe Ku joins us as a first year e-board member. We're excited to help them into their new roles and to hear what new ideas they might have for the future of the club

We'll also be splitting our meetings between the United Methodist Church and the the Greater Des Moines Botanical Garden. See page 3 for details. I'm excited for the chances we'll have to make new connections and gain new members.

The Reiman Garden Orchid Fest is coming in February which is a big event for us, both in terms of fundraising for the year and for fulfilling our obligations for education and outreach. It's also a great opportunity for members to add to their collections.

We're also making plans for a show and sale at the Botanical Garden. It will likely be smaller in scale to the the Reiman Garden show, but it will be open to member sales - yes, members can sell plants at select CIOS events.

Carol Lewnau, our third year e-board member, reminded me in an email she sent describing her experience with the Mid-Iowa Cactus and Succulent

Society Show. "I also belong to the Mid-Iowa Cactus and Succulent Society which meets at the GDMBG and puts on a show and sale in the fall. Members bring in interesting plants to show and the group allows members to sell their extra cactus and succulent plants in addition to bringing in 2 vendors who also sell plants.

The cactus group requires that the plants be pest free, and be priced with the initials of the seller included on that tag. The club kept 15 or 20% of the sales and the rest went to the cactus club member.

The Minnesota Orchid Society allows their members to sell plants a few times a year in a very similar way. We are a small club, so I wanted to make the pitch for this approach early so that people could be thinking about plants in their collection that might be ready to find new homes - encouraging members to take pictures of blooming plants or try to match older pictures with the plants that might be offered for sale."

The CIOS also has similar policies for member sales at events- the full policy doc is on page 9. But in short, we require plants to be in good condition (healthy and free of pests). Plants in poor condition can be removed from the sales tables at the discretion of officers and e-board members present at the event. All items must be tagged with seller ID, price, and item description. All items sold shall be subject to local sales tax and a 10% surcharge on the total price. The Society will collect all revenue from the sale of plants and other related items and will provide to the sellers a check for the total amount of their sales, minus the 10% surcharge and the included local sales tax.

I think a sale/show at the Botanical Garden would be a good opportunity for members to make some room in their collections and make a little extra money for new plants, supplies, and growing space upgrades!

This is especially the case with this year's Speaker's Day. We're bringing in Fred Clarke and Alan Koch. They are great speakers, but they always have a good and varied selection of plants for sale.

Reiman Gardens Orchid Fest

The Reiman Garden's Orchid Fest will be held February 6th-8th 2026. It will start with a member preview night on Friday and sales will open to the public Saturday and Sunday. Friday is generally very busy for sales so we'll need good staffing for setup, running checkout lines for cash and credit, and packing plants.

The CIOS as usual will host sales tables and an information booth. We'll need members to work both. Please consider volunteering for a shift if you can, it's a rewarding experience and greatly helps make our events successful.

Sales table volunteers can be expected to answer some basic care questions, help pack and wrap plants for cold weather, and work cash and card sales.

Information booth volunteers can be expected to answer orchid care questions, and hand out culture sheets and club information.

We'll have sign up sheets at the January meeting with work shifts. Generally work shifts are about two hours long.

Greater Des Moines Botanical Garden Show/Sale

We're holding some of our 2026 meetings at the Greater Des Moines Botanical Garden this year. We decided to hold our "warm weather" meetings there, so the April, May, July, August, September, and October meetings will be at the Botanical Garden. The June potluck will be at the church.

We also worked with the Botanical Garden staff to get access to the larger Juniper and Agave room spaces for our meetings as we had concerns with the smaller Plant Sciences Lab room typically used as the meeting space for societies. In exchange for access to the larger spaces we agreed to hold spring show and sale event. This event would be similar to our 2024 event at the Canoyer Garden Center.

For this event we will allow members to bring orchids and orchid related items for sale - plants, media, pots, books, etc... The CIOS would withhold 10% + applicable sales tax from the members' total sales and issue checks to members for the remaining amount.

We'll also have an orchid display, education display, and an information booth with orchid and club info.

The December meeting of the Central Iowa Orchid Society was called to order by President Brian Johnson. An abbreviated version of the last month's minutes was read and approved. The complete transcript of last month's minutes is available to read in the last Newsletter. The Treasurer's report was given and approved. We have a balance in our checking account of \$3096.37 plus the CD of \$5000. Chriss asked that members pay their 2026 dues as soon as possible. We made a donation to Illinois College, Orchid Recovery Program as a thank you to Larry Zettler for his program on Ghost Orchids. Today is Chriss's last day as Treasurer and we thank him for his many years of serving our Society!!!

President's report - Brian said the November Newsletter was sent out. Please send him photos or stories of your orchid-growing for future newsletters. Brian thanked all those who were involved with the Eastern Iowa Orchid Show. We won a third place ribbon for our display.

Brian thanked Patty, Ardie, Maria, and Olga for helping with the Botanical Garden's Champagne and Chocolates event. (Brian was there helping also!) We had an orchid display and talked about our orchids. Earlier this fall, the Garden's orchids were tested for viruses. About 70% were found to have a virus and were discarded. Many new plants were there for "Adoption" and all were spoken for by the end of the

evening.

Meetings in 2026 - The Botanical Garden would like to have us use their Plant Sciences Room for our monthly meetings; however we are not sure there is enough space for us. They offered us the Agave and/or Juniper Rooms, as long as we have a Show/Sale sometime during the year. After much discussion, a motion was made, seconded, and approved to have the January, February, March, June, November, and December meetings at the church, and the April, May, July, August, September, and October meetings at the Botanical Garden. Plus a Show/Sale in April at the BG. This will take some good communication as to where the meetings will be held.

Election of 2026 officers - The nominees are: President - Brian Johnson, Vice-President - Maria Fedorova, Secretary - Ardie Strawman, Treasurer - Patty Graziano, Librarian - Chriss Barck, 1st year Eboard - Joe Ku, 2nd year Eboard - Jason Rauscher, 3rd year Eboard - Carol Lewnau, Webmaster - Carson Whitlow, and AOS/Orchid Digest Liaison - Maria Fedorova. The nominees were elected by voice vote.

The meeting was adjourned and we enjoyed a tasty potluck lunch.

Society Sales Events Policy

1. Only plants owned by the Society members or owned by the Society may be sold at Society sales events.

2. Non-orchid plants may be offered for sale under the same conditions as for orchids, however may not constitute more than 5% of the total orchid plants displayed.

3. Labeling of non-orchid items, such as fertilizers, if not in original containers, should include directions for use and information on the contents sufficient to identify it in case of ingestion or exposure.

4. A 3" x 5" tag shall be attached to each item. The seller number (membership number) shall be in the upper left hand corner of the card and the price for the item shall be in the upper right hand corner. A description on the item (such as fertilizer, bark, plant, inventory number, etc.) may be added in the center or backside of the tag. This tag is used by the Society for the proper allocation of sales.

5. The seller is responsible for attaching the tag to the sales item. The tag shall be attached with a rubber band, plant clip, or twist tie. (Ideally, a hole punched in the tag and the rubber band or tie put through it allows for easy attachment and removal of the tag when sold.) The tag may be folded in half if applicable. Tape, staples or other attachments which are difficult to remove should not be used.

6. If the seller decides to reduce an items price, the tag must be replaced with a new one. A tag may not show any previous price or indication of a reduced price. Reducing the price of an item is at the discretion of the seller.

7. Plants or items deemed in poor condition or inappropriate for sale at the Society sales event should be removed from the sales table by the seller. If not removed from the sales table, at least two officers and/or members of the e-board must be in agreement, and plant(s) should be removed prior to placing on the sales table. If there is disagreement among the officers and/or e-board members on the removal of the item, a vote of the officers and/or e-board members present should be taken and the majority be the deciding factor.

8. All items sold shall be subject to local sales tax and a 10% surcharge on the total price. Seller pricing of

their merchandise should be cognizant of these costs.

9. The Society will collect all revenue from the sale of plants and other related items. The Society will provide to the sellers a check for the total amount of their sales, minus the 10% surcharge and the included local sales tax. The tags which were placed on their items and used to figure their revenue shall also be returned to the seller. The Society will submit the total sales tax collected to the Iowa Department of Revenue.

10. If the Society decides to approve the acceptance of credit cards at any of the sales events, credit card fees shall be divided proportionally among the sellers.

11. Plants and items for sale will be placed as deemed appropriate by those officers and/or e-board members present at the sales event. Groupings of plants and any identifying, cultural or other pertinent information should take into consideration the space needed and any surrounding items. Pictures, displays and other informational material should be as small as practical and should be reviewed by the officers and/or e-board members present for suitability.

12. The Society will provide cultural information for the major orchid types such as those found on the American Orchid Society website. Sellers offering other genera are encouraged to provide cultural information.

13. The Society shall not be responsible for lost, damaged, or stolen items.

14. The Society shall provide these guidelines to its members prior to any Society sales event by including them in the newsletter immediately prior to the event.
