## Speaker's Day 2025 in Photos

Our 36<sup>th</sup> annual Speaker's Day was held July 19<sup>th</sup> featuring our two speakers Sauer of River Valley Orchids in Ohio, and Frank Cervera of Monster Island Orchids in New York. We had over 60 guests in attendance including our AOS judges. This was an excellent turn out considering scheduling conflicts with the Orchid Society of Minnesota.

Frank's talks focused on various species of Phragmipedium orchids growing in situ and connecting the diverse environmental conditions in their growing ranges to cultural practices we can bring to out collections. Eric's morning talk was an excellent primer on understanding orchid taxonomy and tags and included links to a variety of resources for researching orchid parentage. IN the afternoon he introduced us to a wide range of Central and South American orchids including some lesser-known but intriguing genera including Scaphosepalum and Zootrophion.

New this year we added a pub-quiz style trivia game during the lunch break. This was well received and we received several requests to bring it back in the future and possible include a shortened version during special monthly meetings. A huge thank you goes out to Jason Rauscher for organizing and presenting the quiz.

As always, thank you to everyone who attended; support from the orchid community makes this event possible.

The days are also getting shorter so if you're growing plants with seasonal blooming triggers like Cattleya under lights like me, it's a good idea to make sure you're adjusting your timers to mimic the shortening days. This can help to stimulate fall blooms.

And if you weren't able to make this year's Speaker's Day I hope you'll be able to attend next year. Our scheduled speakers are Fred Clark of Sunset Valley Orchids and Alan Koch of Gold Country Orchids. They'll both have an interesting variety of plants for sale and they are great speakers with a lot of knowledge.
