# President's Message

Brian Johnson



June started cool this year, but is ending with plenty of heat. These can be challenging conditions, especially for those summering plants outdoors or managing a greenhouse. Even indoor growers can face growing space changes as our A/C systems cycle more frequently to keep up with the heat, leading to dry indoor air and increased air movement.

Both will cause more rapid drying - so keep an eye on your collection and up your watering cycle frequency as needed. Also consider increasing fertilizer frequency to make up for losses from increased watering cycles and increased summer growth rates. This is especially important if plants are receiving rain directly while growing outside or if you're using harvested rain water on your indoor collection.

Hot dry weather is also prime growth conditions for spider mites. When inspecting your plants be sure to check the undersides of the leaves for telltale signs fine yellow stippling on leaves, fine webbing on the undersides of the leaves, and a dusty/silvery appearance on the foliage.

Mites are tiny and can be easily spread accidentally They can hitch a ride on your clothes, hair, and skin and move from garden to orchid collection. If you're working in the garden, mowing, weeding, etc... I recommend changing clothes and washing up after working in the garden before moving on to work on your orchid collection.

Left, Below: A closeup of the flower. This plant has a 'peloric' form. Pelorism is the abnormal production of radially symmetrical flowers in a species that usually produces bilaterally symmetrical flowers. In orchids pelorism generally presents as the petals taking on coloration and shape of the lip to varying degrees.
