Future Meeting Locations

In March the Greater Des Moines Botanical Garden reached out to us regarding the use of their space for our monthly meetings and potential show and sale events.

Meeting at the Botanical Garden offered a couple of potential advantages. The space would be offered to us for free, saving us \$50 per month in rental fees. And our meetings would be more accessible to the public, giving us more opportunities to attract new members.

After an e-board visit late in April, we determined some potential concerns with the space. Primarily, the plant lab space is smaller than the church space we're currently meeting in, and while the Garden facilities have been re-worked for accessibility, it is not as convenient as the church, as there is a longer walk.

We voted at our May meeting to hold our September and October meetings at the Botanical Garden to test the space and determine if it would be a good fit for us.

For our October meeting we hosted Larry Zettler for a Zoom talk on Ghost Orchid conservation. The meeting was well attended with 22 members, giving us a good feeling for the capability of the space in terms of capacity and A/V support.

So, now we need to decide if we are going to move our meeting location from the Union Park United Methodist Church to the Greater Des Moines Botanical Garden.

Benefits of Moving:

- Free monthly meeting space, saving us \$50 per month in rent
- Connection with other societies and increased public visibility could be good for membership recruitment
- Tighter relationship with GDMBG means more opportunity for educational program participation and volunteer work including assisting with their orchid collection
- Spaces include built-in A/V equipment making presentations and program setup more convenient

Drawbacks/Concerns:

- Space is smaller than the church, the October meeting felt like close to maximum capacity between people, plants, show and tell, and program.
- Accessibility is good, but the longer walking distance is more challenging for loading and for members with mobility concerns
- Food service is limited to GDMBG approved catering options. We would have to make alternate arrangements for our June potluck and holiday party

No matter which location we choose for our future meeting space, I think partnering with the Botanical Garden for educational programming and potential sales and show events would be beneficial for the club.

October Meeting Brief

The October 2025 meeting of the Central Iowa Orchid Society began with a Zoom Presentation by Larry Zettler on Ghost Orchids. After the presentation and questions, the meeting was called to order by President Brian Johnson. The Secretary gave an abbreviated version of the September minutes, and it was approved. It was noted that a long-time member, Lois Godwin, had passed away and we sent flowers to her funeral. Ardie read the Thank you note from her daughter, saying that her mom "would have loved the flowers." The Treasurer's report was read and approved. We have a balance in our checking account of \$3161.51 plus the CD of \$5000. We have the Lion's Club reserved for Speaker's Day 2026 and have given them a \$200 deposit. Chriss said that there are several new magazines which can be checked out.

President's report. Brian said that the newsletter was emailed out. He encouraged members to send him photos and/or stories of their orchids.

Brian said that we had a Zoom Eboard meeting on Sept. 25. Several topics were discussed, one of which is having members share their stories of their successes and challenges in growing their orchids.

The Eastern Iowa Orchid Show will be Nov. 1 and 2 in Cedar Rapids. Joe and Elaine will be working on this. Maria would like a list of plants that members will be sending so the Eastern Iowa people can make the tags for the plants. Brian will be sending an email to let members know when and where to meet with their plants for the show. November is the month for the Nominating Committee to present their list of officers for 2026. Brian agreed to be President for 2026, Maria for Vice President, Ardie for Secretary, Patty Graziano for Treasurer, and 1st year Eboard member Joe.

Our next meeting will be Nov. 2 and Brian will not be here as he will be returning with plants from the Eastern Iowa Orchid Show. We talked about having an alternate President (Jason) or moving the meeting to the Sunday before (Oct. 26) We would need to check with the church to see that the room is available. We are trying out the Botanical Garden for our meetings in Sept. and Oct. and would be returning to the church in November.

The Botanical Garden is having an event on Nov. 14, 6-9pm, called Champagne and Chocolate. They have asked us to have an information table, and possibly sell orchids. They are remodeling their orchid room and are looking for many new plants, specifically ones that will grow well in the conditions of that area. A thought would be to have attendees purchase orchids and then donate them back to the Botanical Gardens, or donate a specific amount toward purchase of some larger plants. We would need to contact vendors to see what might be available.

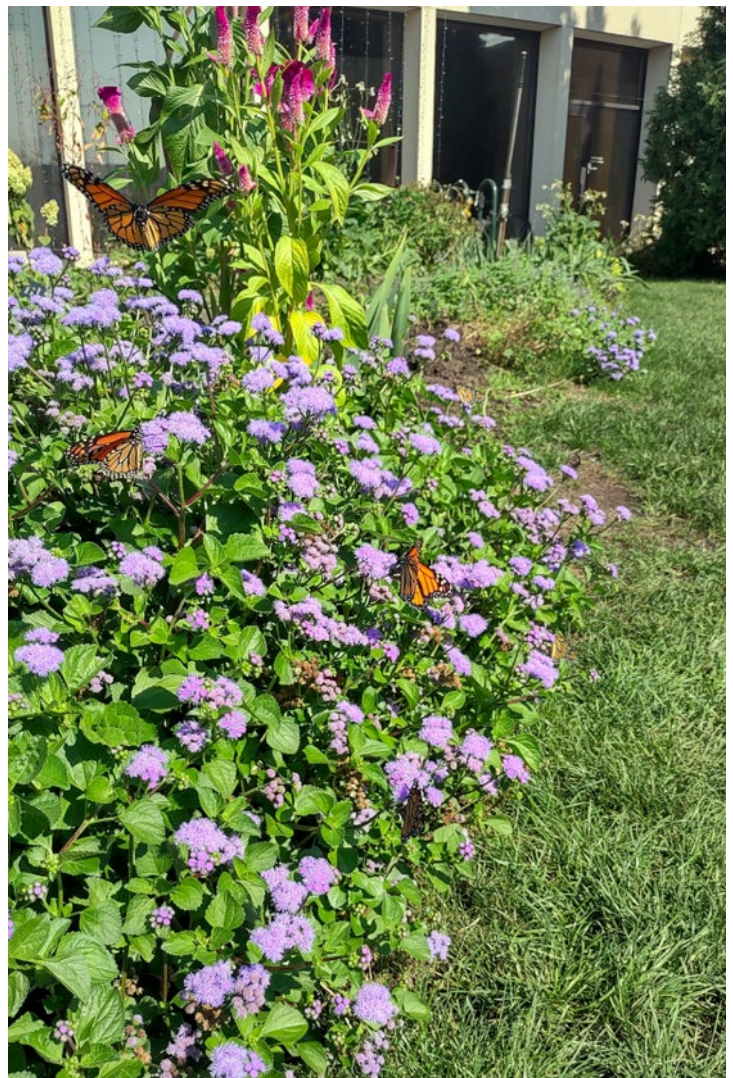
The Botanical Garden has asked us if we are interested on having an Advanced Orchid Care class, probably in February 2026. We will think about this.

Members will be dropped from the roll if dues have not been paid in six months.
