# January Meeting Brief

The January meeting of the Central Iowa Orchid Society was called to order by President Brian Johnson. We have 2 visitors here today - Barb and her son, Daniel.

The Secretary's report was read and approved.

New Treasurer Patty read the Treasurer's report. She announced that she is the new official signer of our bank account. We have a balance in the checking account of \$2824.68, plus the CD of \$5597.77. We will make a tax write off for Doc Bannister for his monthly donations. Yearly dues are due now. Chriss Barck gave the Librarian's report that there are new magazines here now, which can be checked out.

President's report - Brian announced that the December newsletter was emailed to members. If you did not receive it, let him know. He also said he welcomes photos and stories about members' orchids for the Newsletter. Brian welcomed new Eboard members Patty Graziano as Treasurer and Joe Ku as 1<sup>st</sup> year Eboard member.

Jason Rauscher gave his report on the First to Bloom Contest, which was won by Carol Lewnau. The photo contest was won by Rose. Each received a photo prize. Brian asked if there was continuing interest in the Contests and whether we should continue them. Members nodded Yes. # Membership

The Central Iowa Orchid Society (CIOS) was organized in 1960. It is a nonprofit social club. Membership in the CIOS also includes membership in the Mid-America Orchid Congress.

Yearly dues are \$15 for an individual or \$25 for a family. **New members joining after July 1st are only required to pay one-half the annual membership fee - \$7 for an individual or \$12 for a family.** Membership can be renewed starting in November and dues become delinquent after the February meeting.

Meetings are generally held on the first Sunday of every month at 2:00 pm.
